BYLAW NO: 14.

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH A CEMETERY FOR THE VILLAGE OF BLAINE LAKE OUTSIDE
THE LIMITS OF THE SAID VILLAGE, AND TO PROVIDE FOR REGULATING AND
CONTROLLING SAME:

The Council of the Village of Blaine Lake enacts as follows:

1. All and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the northwest quarter of section six (6), township fourty five (45), range six (6), West of the third (3d) Meridian and containing two (2) acres more or less, which may be more particularly described as follows: - Commencing at the iron post planted at the northwest corner of the said quarter section, thence easterly along the northerly limit of the said quarter section a distance of four chains (4) more or less to an iron post, then southerly parallel to the western limit of the said quarter section a distance of five chains (5) more or less to an iron post, thence westerly parallel to the said northerly limit a distance of four chains (4) more or less to a point on the said westerly limit where an iron post has been planted, thence northerly along the said westerly limit a distance of five chains (5) more or less to the point of commencement---

shall be and is appropriated as a Public Cemetery, to be called the Blaine Lake Cemetery;

2. That the management of the said cemetery be and is vested in the Village Council, who shall have the control and management of the cemetery and shall allot and dispose of burial lots therein, with power to make regulations governing same, not inconsistent with this bylaw;

3. That burial lots in the said cemetery may be sold to applicants, the whole of the purchase money to be paid down at the time of selecting the lot at and for the following prices and sums: that is to say:

the sum of eight (8) dollars for a single lot of " ten by ten " 10x10foot

the sum of fifteen (15) dollars for a double lot of " ten by twenty "

20 x 20 foot

the sum of twenty eight (28) dollars for a block of four (4) lots,

" fourty by fourty " 40 x 40 foot;

4, That conveyances in fee simple of any burial lot so sold, be executed and delivered to the purchaser or purchasers by the overseer and the secretary- treasurer of the Village of Blaine Lake in the name of and under the corporate seal of the Village.

5, That any such conveyance, in addition to the ordinary provisions, shall contain the following special condition: subject however to the conditions and limitations, and with the privileges specified in the rules and regulations now in force and which may hereafter come into force governing the said cemetery.

6, Proprietors of lots shall not allow interments to be made therein for a remuneration.

7, The proprietor of any lot shall have the right subject to the approval of the Council, to erect any proper stones or monuments thereon and cultivate shrubs and plants in the same, but no tree or shrub growing within the lot or border shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the Council.

8, If any trees or shrubs situated in any lot shall by means of their roots, branches or otherwise become detrimental to the adjacent lots or avenues or dangerous or inconvenient to strangers, the Council shall have the right to direct the removal of the said trees or shrubs, or such parts thereof as are detrimental, dangerous or inconvenient.

9, If any monument, inclosure or any inscription be placed in or upon any lot, which shall be deemed by the Council to be improper or injurious to the appearance of the lots or graves, they shall have the right to remove the said object or objects.

10, It shall be the duty of the Council from time to time to make such rules and regulations for the government of the grounds as it may be necessary and proper to secure and promote the general objects of the cemetery.

11, The proprietors of lots and their families shall be allowed access to the grounds at all times.

12, Purchasers may improve their lots whenever it suits their convenience.

13, The interment of the poor and all persons unable to pay the necessary

expences shall be in such proportions of the grounds as may from time to time be designated, and the Council is hereby empowered to furnish free such graves for the poor at their discretion.

14, All funds and fees received from the sale of burial plots shall be applied solely to the purchasing, laying out, fencing, ornamentation and keeping the said cemetery and roads and accesses to the same, and in defraying the necessary expenses of the same.

15, The Council shall have power to employ such surveyors, gardeners, caretakers as they may deem necessary, and to pay them such remuneration as may be deemed proper.

16, The caretaker shall have supervision over the whole cemetery subject to the direction of the Council.

17, Any person who willfully destroys, mutilates, defaces, injures or removes any tomb, monument, gravestone or any structure placed in the cemetery, or any railing or other work for the protection or ornamentation of the cemetery, or burial lot, or willfully destroys, cuts, breaks or injures any tree, shrub or plant in the cemetery, or plays any game, or sport, or discharges fire-arms (save at a military funeral) or who willfully or unlawfully disturbs persons assembled for the purpose of burying a body in the cemetery, shall be subject to a fine of not more than 25 dollars.

18, All persons are prohibited from picking any flowers, either wild or cultivated, or from breaking any tree, shrub or plant.

19, All persons are prohibited from writing or defacing, or injuring any monument, fence or other structure in, or belonging to the cemetery.

20, All persons disturbing the quiet or good order of the place by noise or other improper conduct, or who shall violate any of the cemetery rules, will be removed from the grounds.

21, Any person found guilty of any infraction of any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to a penalty of not more than twenty five (25)dollar
