


A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF BLAINE LAKE RESPECTING THE ELIMINATION
OF OUTSIDE PRIVIES.


WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient in the orderly and hygienic development of the Town of Blaine Lake to eliminate the use of outside privies and to cause to be removed or demolished any privy structure deemed to be an actual or potential rat harborage.

NOW THEREFORE, the council of the Town of Blaine Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:


1. The council may, by resolution, require the owners of premises which are connected to the Town system of sanitary sewers to cease to use, remove or demolish any outside privy situated on the property of the premises concerned.
2. The owner of property referred to in Clause 1 hereof shall, within a period of thirty-(30) days from the date of notice, requiring him so to do, mailed to him by registered mail, addressed to his address, as shown in the last revised Assessment Roll of the Town, cease to use, remove or demolish any outside privy on the property set forth in said Notice, and shall cause the said privy vault to be filled with earth to ground level.
3. If the owner of said premises fails or neglects to comply with the said Notice, within the time therein limited, the Town may do the work required and charge the expense thereof against the property set forth in said Notice, and said charge shall be added to the taxes assessed against said property and be collectible as such.

Read three times and finally passed this 11th day of October A.D. 1966
by unanimous vote of all members of the council present.
