CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF BLAINE LAKE, IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN.

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE THE BUILDING AND SITE KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS ST. ANDREW'S ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH SITUATED ON LOTS 10 AND 11, BLOCK 6, PLAN H 3043 AND LOCATED AT 102 SECOND AVENUE EAST AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE.

WHEREAS Part III of The Heritage Property Act, 1980, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural, historical or natural value or interest;

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Blaine Lake has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises known as LA CORPORATION EPISCOPALE CATHOLIQUE ROMAINE DE PRINCE ALBERT, at 1415 4th Avenue West, PRINCE ALBERT, Saskatchewan a Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality with the first publication at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of consideration of the bylaw and with the last publication at least seven (7) days prior to the date of that consideration;

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Blaine Lake, in the Province of Saskatchewan enact as follows:

 There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as LA CORPORATION EPISCOPALE CATHOLIQUE ROMAINE DE PRINCE ALBERT and the lands legally known as:

> Lots Numbered Ten (10) and Eleven (11) in Block Numbered Six (6)

In the Town of Blaine Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan in the Dominion of Canada according to a Plan of Record in the Land Titles Office for the West Saskatchewan Land Registration District as Plan H 3043.

Reserving to the Crown All Mines and Minerals

The significance of the site is as follows:

- (1) Built in 1914 and still in use.
- (2) Architectural and historical value.
- The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a certified copy of this bylaw to be registered against the property described above in the proper Land Titles Office.
- 3. The Town Administrator is hereby authorised to cause a copy of this bylaw to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Minister of Culture and Recreation, and to cause notice of the passing of this bylaw.
- 4. This bylaw shall come into force and effect this 12th day of April, 1983.
