A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF BLAINE LAKE IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN TO REGULATE PLUMBING AND DRAINAGE AND THE DISPOSAL OF SEWAGE WITHIN THE TOWN OF BLAINE LAKE.

The Council of the Town of Blaine Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. The regulations governing plumbing and drainage made by the Minister of Health and approved by the Lieutenant Governeor in Council under the Public Health Act shall apply to and govern all plumbing and drainage within the Town of Blaine Lake except as here and after altered or revised.
- 2. Application for a plumbing permit shall be made by the plumber or the plumbing contractor on a prescribed form, and accompanied by the required fee to the Town Administrator.
- 3. The fee for a permit shall be as specified in the current Provincial Plumbing and Drainage Regulations.
- 4. The plumbing inspector, upon the approval and recommendations of the Medical Health Officer, shall be a Public Health Inspector of the Health Region.
- 5. All persons undertaking the installation or repairing of or the addition to a plumbing system shall be in possession of a certificate of qualification as a journeyman plumber issued by the Province of Saskatchewan or shall be in possession of a second class plumber's status certificate issued prior to December 1, 1976 by the Saskatchewan Department of Labour.
- 6. (1) Every person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw or fails to comply therewith is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalty prescribed in this section.
 - (2) An individual who commits an offence is liable:
 - (a) for a first offence, to a fine of not more than \$1,000 and to a further fine of not more than \$50 for each day during which the offence continues;
 - (b) for a second offence or subsequent offence, to a fine of not more than \$5,000 and to a further fine of not more than \$50 for each day during which the offence continues.
 - (3) A corporation which commits an offence is liable:
 - (a) for a first offence, to a fine of not more than \$5,000 and to a further fine of not more than \$500 for each day during which the offence continues;
 - (b) for a second or subsequent offence, to a fine of not more than \$10,000 and to a further fine of not more than \$500 for each day during which the offence continues.

- 7. Bylaw No. 5/83 is hereby repealed.
- 8. This Bylaw comes into effect upon approval by the Minister of Health.
