Town of Blaine Lake January, 2010 Newsletter

The Town and BLCA Offices will be closed on Tuesday, January 12, 2010 for the Olympic Torch Relay.

WATER RATE INCREASE

Effective January 1st, 2010 water rates will increase to \$33.50/month, waste rates are \$9.95/month and sewage rates are \$10.00/month. The monthly billing amount will be \$53.45 for 3300 gallons of water. If more water is consumed than the 3300 gallons the overage will be charged at a rate of \$1.02 /100 gallons.

Annual Water Billings

The option of being billed annually for water, sewer and waste disposal service is available to all local residents. People choosing to pay this way are billed for the entire year in January and given a 5% discount. The only time a person would receive a bill or need to pay more than this is when their quarterly consumption exceeds the maximum usage of 9900 gallons per quarter, and then they are just billed for the overage. This year the annual billing will be \$609.35 (including the discount).

Any resident, who is not already being billed annually but is interested in being billed for water, sewer and garbage on an annual basis (once per year) can contact the Town office for more information.

DOG LICENSE REMINDER

Dog licenses are due in January 2010.

The license fees are:

- \$10.00 for a spayed or neutered non-restricted dog;
- \$25.00 for a non-restricted dog that is not spayed or neutered;
- \$55.00 for a restricted dog (including Pit bull terriers, Doberman pinschers, Rottweilers, Bull
- Mastiffs, Wolf cross, Coyote cross, American Staffordshire, Bulldogs or any trained guard dog).

Any licenses that are not renewed by February 28th, 2010 will have a \$10.00 penalty added to them. If you no longer have your dog, please contact the Town Office at 497-2531 and let us know.

SNOW REMOVAL

Please do not clear snow from your lots onto the streets. This practice creates a hazard to vehicle and pedestrian traffic. RCMP will be enforcing Section 22 of the Highways & Transportation Act which prohibits placing of any objects that may obstruct or interfere with public access of the street. The Town has designated several spots where residents can haul snow from their lots to. Please contact the Town Office at 497-2531 for these locations. By placing the snow in these specific places we hope to be able to control some of the spring run-off. Thank you for your co-operation

SNOW REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS

To accommodate snow removal from the sidewalks please park vehicles at least 1 foot away from the sidewalk. This ensures clearance for the quad and blade. Thank you!

Online Payments through Bank of Nova Scotia

Effective February, 2010 we will no longer be able to receive online utility and tax payments through the Bank of Nova Scotia. This is due to an increase in user fees from Scotia Bank which makes it too costly for the Town to continue to offer this service through Scotia Bank. People who pay through other Financial Institutions will not be affected by this change.

AED/1st Aid

We now have 3 AED (automated external defibrillators) in our community. One is at the skating rink and one at the curling rink. The newest one is in the school. This AED was donated by Wally Dutchak of WPD Ambulance in memory of Rick Lamontagne. It is available for after school hours community events. The more people we have trained in our community, the increased likelihood that these defibrillators will be used when the need arises. A Red Cross CPR/AED course is 4-6 hours in length. This course teaches the basics of choking and CPR/AED. A Red Cross Emergency First Aid/CPR/AED course is 6.5 - 8 hours in length. This course teaches the basics of choking, CPR/AED, how to deal with chest pain, breathing emergencies and bleeding. A Red Cross Standard First Aid/CPR/AED course is 16-18 hours in length. This course includes all topics taught in the Emergency First Aid course and other medical emergencies such as diabetic, seizure, and fainting. A miniumum 4 people are needed to teach any course and a deposit is required before any registration is accepted. Provincial Toilet Replacement Rebate Program

There is a \$50.00 rebate per eligible toilet replacement available through the Saskatchewan Watershed Authority. In order to receive this rebate the toilet you are replacing must have a flush volume of at least 13 litres per flush and you must replace it with a CSA approved 6 litre or less flush toilet.
