Free Garbage Day Saturday, May 25th

From 10:00 am to 12:00 noon and 1:00 to 4:00 pm on Saturday, May 25th. Each household is permitted to haul 1 free half-ton load of garbage to the transfer station, after that, regular rates apply.

Open Air Fires in Town

The only burning that is permitted in Town must be done in a noncombustible receptacle constructed of concrete, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness and it must be covered with a heavy gauge screen with openings not to exceed 13 mm. Only seasoned wood or charcoal are permitted for use in the fire pit. Fires must be supervised, properly ventilated, and the smoke from the fire must not interfere with another person's use and enjoyment of their property.

Community Garage Sale

The Annual Community Garage Sale will be held on the May long weekend, May 17, 18, 19 and 20. Watch for balloons in front of those households participating. Any household wanting to participate in the Sale should put balloons up on their property on the days they are hosting their sale.

Water Safety

As most of you are aware, during the week of April 8th some residence experienced "pink" water coming out of their taps. Please be assured that the water was SAFE. Our Public Works men test our water on a daily basis and a sample is sent to the Provincial Lab for testing on a weekly basis. While we were experiencing the "pink" water our staff did an excellent job. They were diligent at monitoring the situation and increased the number of water tests they were doing. At no time during this period was the water "unsafe" for use. The "pink" colour was caused by our normal treatment processes, but because the amount of water entering our water lines was reduced, the pink colouring became more noticeable. Again, at no time during this period was our water unsafe. Thank you for your patience during this time.

Animal Control

Residents are reminded that all dogs or cats must be licensed and kept on a leash when not on their owner's property. If a dog or cat defecates on any public or private property other than the property of the owner, the owner is responsible to immediately remove and dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner. Pet owners must also remove animal feces from their own property in a prompt and sanitary manner. Thank you for your cooperation.
