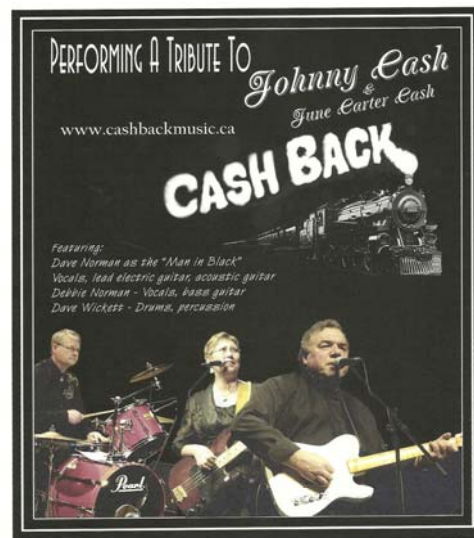

Snow Removal Policy

Hopefully our first snowfall is several weeks away..... However, residents are reminded that it is illegal to clean snow from your property onto Town Streets or Town Property or any property that you do not own. If you are moving snow off of your property, or if you are having someone remove snow from your property it must be hauled away. Please contact the Town Office for approved snow dump sites. ***Anyone caught putting snow from their property onto streets, back alleys or property other than their own will have the costs of loading and hauling that snow away added to their property taxes. Please make any contractor that you may hire to remove snow from your property aware of this, as you are responsible for snow that is removed from your property and not properly disposed of.***

A reminder as well, that the Town will not be clearing back alleys this year. Council has decided that the Town’s priority must be to keep our streets graded and snow from the streets hauled away.
