

On September 15th, 2016 Saskatoon Conservation Officers received a TIP Call regarding a large number of migratory birds that had been wasted and dumped in a field about 2 miles/3, 2 km north east of the town of Blaine Lake.

Officers located 240 birds at that location that had no meat salvaged. There were 135 whole ducks, 43 whole Canada geese and 61 Snow/Ross geese and only 3 Snow/Ross geese where the breast meat had been taken. Do you know who is responsible for all of these birds?
