Town Council Meetings

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Council will be <u>Monday, Sept 19th 2016</u> and Monday Oct.17th at 8:00am in Council Chambers. Council Meetings are open to the Public.

Fall Clean Up Days – On Wednesday, October 5 the Town will pick up unbagged compostable garden refuse from the back alleys. Please have refuse in the back alley by 8:00 am.

Reminder of Parking Bylaws

No operator of a vehicle shall park said vehicle:

- 1) Within any alley or lake
- 2) So as to obstruct any private driveway
- Within three (3) meters of the entrance of any alley or lane on all streets where parallel parking is permitted.
- 4) Within three (3) meters of a fire hydrant measured parallel to the curb.
- 5) Within six (6) meters on either side of any sidewalk crossing.
- Within six (6) meters of block corners at intersections on streets where parallel parking is permitted.
- That has a greater manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of more than one (1) ton on any highway.

Parking of Unlicensed Vehicles

No vehicle shall be parked on a public street unless it is displaying license plates for the current year.

Maximum parking – 72 hours

Any vehicle parked for an uninterrupted period of time in excess of seventy-two (72) hours on any street or boulevard.

Fall/Winter Landfill Hours

The landfill will return to Fall/Winter hours effective October 1, 2016 Wednesdays and Saturdays ONLY 10:00 to noon and 1-4 pm (closed for lunch) Community in Bloom wishes to say "thank you" to everyone that has worked to make our Town so beautiful this summer. 

Development Act, 2007 to amend Bylaw No. 2013-05, known as the Zoning Bylaw

INTENT

The proposed bylaw amendment will establish a minimum rear yard requirement for buildings located in the Town Centre Commercial District (C1).

AFFECTED LANDS

All properties situated in Town Centre Commercial District (C1) zoning areas.

REASON

The reason for the amendment is to establish minimum rear yard requirements.

VOTER ID

The purpose of the voter ID requirements is to maintain the integrity of local election processes. Your name and address must

appear in some form on your voter identification documents.

Photo ID is your BEST option

Acceptable photo identification is ID that is government issued, valid and has your photo, name and address. Example include:

- A valid Saskatchewan Driver's Licence.
- A valid Saskatchewan ID card issued by SGI or any motor licence issuer.
- Any other valid government issued photo ID issued by a Canadian government whether federal, provincial or municipal, or an agency of that government, so long as it includes your name and address.

Non-Photo ID options

If you don't have and cannot obtain photo ID, you can present two other pieces of information, as long as both contain your name and at least one contains your address.

Examples include:

- Valid ID cards of certificates issued by the Canadian or Saskatchewan government, a Saskatchewan municipality or school division, a Saskatchewan Indian band, the Metis Nation of Saskatchewan or an agency of one of these entities.
- Personal correspondence, benefit/contribution statements and tax/assessment notices issued by any of the above entities.
- Bank/credit union cards, credit cards and statements.
- Utility bills and statements issued within six months of the date of the election.
- Personalized attestation of residence, letter of stay or admission form issued by a seniors or student residence, long term care or shelter facility.
