Open Air Fires in Town

The only burning that is permitted in Town must be done in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness and it must be covered with a heavy gauge screen with openings not to exceed 13 mm. The only thing that can be burnt in the fire pit is **seasoned wood or charcoal**. Fires must be supervised, properly ventilated, and the smoke from the fire must not interfere with another person's use and enjoyment of their property.



CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PETS

Residents are reminded that all dogs or cats must be licensed, and kept on a leash when not on their owner's property. If a dog or cat defecates (poops) on any public or private property other than the property of the owner, the owner is responsible to immediately remove and dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner. Pet owners must also remove animal feces from their own property in a prompt and sanitary manner. Thank you for your cooperation.

BYLAW NO. 2/2006

A Bylaw of the Town of Blaine Lake, in the Province of Saskatchewan to regulate property maintenance and to provide for the abatement of nuisances within the Town of Blaine Lake.

PURPOSE:

1. The purpose of this Bylaw is to establish standards for the maintenance and occupancy of property, to ensure that such standards be maintained, and to provide for the abatement of nuisances, including property, activities, or things that adversely affect:

- (a) The safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
- (b) People's use and enjoyment of their property; or
- (c) The amenity of a neighborhood.

OVERGROWN GRASS AND WEEDS:

- 7.1 Notwithstanding the generality of Section 4, no owner or occupant of land shall cause or permit the land to be overgrown with grass or weeds.
- 7.2 For the purpose of this section, "overgrown" means in excess of 20 centimetres in height.
- 7.3 This section shall not apply to any growth which forms part of a natural garden that has been deliberately planted to produce ground cover, including one or more species of wildflowers, shrubs, perennials, grassess or combinations of them, whether native or non-native, consistent with a managed and natural landscape other than regularly mown grass.
- 7.4 No owner or occupant of land shall cause or permit any adjoining boulevards or lanes to be overgrown with grass and weeds.
- 7.5 After having been served with an order respecting property overgrown with grass and weeds under this section, no person shall permit or allow lands described in that order to become overgrown with grass and weeds again.

UNTIDY AND UNSIGHTLY PROPERTY:

- 8.1 Notwithstanding the generality of Section 4, no person shall cause or permit any land or buildings to become untidy and unsightly due to the accumulation of new or used lumber, cardboard ,paper,newspapers,appliances,tires,cans,barrels, scrap metal or other waste materials or junk.
- 8.2 After having been served with an order respecting untidy of unsightly property under this section, no person shall permit or allow lands described in that order to become untidy or unsightly again.

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8.3 No owner of land shall cause or permit any adjoining boulevards or lanes to become untidy and unsightly due to the accumulation of new or used lumber, cardboard, paper, newspapers, appliances, tires, cans, barrels, scrap metal or other waste materials or junk.

REMINDER OF PARKING BYLAWS

No operator of a vehicle shall park said vehicle:

- 1) Within any alley or lake
- 2) So as to obstruct any private driveway
- 3) Within three (3) meters of the entrance of any alley or lane on all streets where parallel parking is permitted.
- 4) Within three (3) meters of a fire hydrant measured parallel to the curb.
- 5) Within six (6) meters on either side of any sidewalk crossing.
- 6) Within six (6) meters of block corners at intersections on streets where parallel parking is permitted.
- 7) That has a greater manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of more than one (1) ton on any highway.

Parking of Unlicensed Vehicles

No vehicle shall be parked on a public street unless it is displaying license plates for the current year.

Maximum parking – 72 hours

Any vehicle parked for an uninterrupted period of time in excess of seventy-two (72) hours on any street or boulevard.

Trailer or Semi-Trailer Parked

- (1) No person shall leave a trailer or semi-trailer parked on a highway which is unattached from the vehicle for moving same.
- (2) Trailers attached to a vehicle that has a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of one ton or less may be permitted to park on a highway in the

- Town of Blaine Lake for a period not exceeding two (2) hours then must be moved to an off street location for a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours.
- (3) No person shall park a trailer or semi-trailer on a boulevard or the area set aside for a boulevard.
- (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to semi-trailers or recreational vehicles.

Parking of Recreational Vehicles

- (1) An owner or operator of a recreational vehicle shall not park the recreational vehicle on a highway in the Town of Blaine Lake for more than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle to an off-street location for a period of not less than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle may be parked again on a highway.
- (2) No owner or operator of a recreational vehicle shall park the recreational vehicle on any highway pursuant to this Subsection in such a manner as to constitute a hazard to other persons using the street.
- (3) No owner or operator of a recreational vehicle shall park the recreational vehicle on a boulevard or an area set aside for a boulevard.
- (4) Any recreational vehicle parked on a highway pursuant to this section shall display a current license plate.

Parking Vehicles Exceeding 7 Meters in Length

Subject to Sections 18 and 19, no person

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driving a vehicle, combination of vehicles or other vehicles in excess of 7 meters shall park on any highway in the Town of Blaine Lake for a period of longer than two (2) hours. Cheques received from unsuccessful bidders will be returned.

Highest or only Tender not necessarily accepted.
