Mayor's Message

Fall is quickly arriving and there is still a lot to do. The drainage program is around 90% completed and is working great. When we had the 1.5 inches of rain the other day, we drove around town and located all the problem areas remaining. (Culverts plugged, collapsed or too small). These issues are now being addressed and should hopefully fix any flow problems. We are also looking into a fix for the driveway issues that came up as a result of the drainage repair. A rubber wedge with a slot in the bottom to allow the water to flow is what we are looking at. We would like to wait until we are finished so we can determine how many are required and what sizes etc. The Town is looking at hiring a tree cutting company to cut some Maple trees that are causing flow issues and trees that block stop signs and site at intersections around Town. The Town has been busy this summer and I would like the Thank everyone for being so patient and understanding with the issues that came up. Summer construction is a part of living in Saskatchewan. We are trying hard to repair our aging infrastructure and have a very aggressive maintenance program to keep it going. All the fire hydrants, isolation valves and most of the curb stops have been repaired or replaced. They are numbered now and are exercised on a regular basis.

Last thing I would like to let you know is that the Town Hall Meeting will be held on **November 20, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Senior Citizen**'s **Centre**. We will be going over the suggestions you came up with at the Spring meeting and determine which items we feel could go on next year's budget. Be sure to bring your friends, ideas and enthusiasm as this is YOUR TOWN and I believe we can make it even better than it already is.




PROBLEMS & PREVENTION

Since skunks are annoying particularly for their habit of digging up yards to find prey, homeowners should take steps to prevent infestations. Controlling overgrowth and treating yards will reduce attractiveness to skunks. To take further action seal garbage cans, store pet food securely, and remove debris. The Town does have skunk/cat traps available for use but please be advised that the Town DOES NOT TRAP OR DISPOSE of the animal, due to a liability issue. The Town could be sued for damages caused by the skunk to the homeowner's property.


