Open Air Fires in Town

The only burning that is permitted in Town must be done in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness and it must be covered with a heavy gauge screen with openings not to exceed 13 mm. The only thing that can be burnt in the fire pit is **seasoned wood or charcoal**. Fires must be supervised, properly ventilated, and the smoke from the fire must not interfere with another person's use and enjoyment of their property.





CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PETS

Resident's are reminded that all dogs or cats must be licensed, and kept on a leash when not on their owner's property. If a dog or cat defecates (poops) on any public or private property other than the property of the owner, the owner is responsible to immediately removal and disposal of the feces in a sanitary manner. Pet owners must also remove animal feces from their own property in a prompt and sanitary manner. Thank you for your cooperation.

This year we hope to repair or replace the remaining hydrants and isolation valve before we attempt to resurface the center of the road ways. Curb stops which are located off the road way will also be numbered, exercised, repaired or replaced as we can get to them. We can do only so many a year due to the cost.

Now is the time of year that Council prepares its budget looking at all the item they identify as priorities for this year. Things like roads, sidewalks, equipment replacement, water and sewer lines are considered. Our Town hall meetings have also helped us to identify some of your wishes. The next Town hall meeting will be in the fall so please have your ideas and suggestions ready.

Two ideas from the last few Town hall meeting have been slowly starting to proceed. The community committees that have recently been started are: 1. Seniors Housing requirements 2. After school, weekends, and summer holidays activities for our youth. We need a few more people who may want to sit on either committee or may just want to contribute in some way.
