Utility & Tax Payments Did You Know??

That the Town of Blaine Lake accepts E- transfers as a form of Utility & Tax payments. Simply send your e-transfer to blainelake@sasktel.net and put your house address and what you are paying towards (water or taxes) in the message area. We then process the payment and mail you a receipt.

Open Air Fires in Town

The only burning that is permitted in Town must be done in a non-combustible, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness and it must be covered with a heavy gauge screen with opening not to exceed 13 mm. The only thing that can be burnt in the fire pit is seasoned wood or charcoal. Fires must be supervised, properly ventilated, and smoke from the fire must not interfere with another person's use and enjoyment of their property

Clean Up After Your Pets

Resident's are reminded that all dogs and cats must be licensed, and kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. Please refrain from letting your pets run at large. If a dog or cat

defecates (poops) on any public or private property other than the property of the owner, the owner is responsible to immediately remove and dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner. Pet owners must also remove animal feces from their own property in a prompt and sanitary manner. Thank you for your co-operation

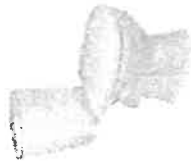

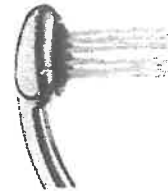
Leaks Cost Money: Types of Leaks

WASHROOM LEAKS



TOILETS:

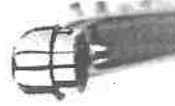
A running toilet could be wasting more than 750 L of water a day.



SHOWER HEADS:

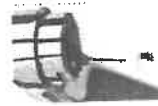
A shower head that drops 10 drips/minute wastes more than 1,800 L per year.

FAUCET LEAKS



DRIP:

1 drip/second wastes 32.7 L daily and 11,937.6 L yearly



DRIBBLE:

3 drips/second wastes 98.1 L daily and 35,813.2 L yearly



DROOL:

5 drips/second wastes 163.5 L daily and 59,688.6 L yearly
