Council has carried out the 1st month of their ambitious schedule including weekly meetings covering Council Orientation, Long Term Planning and Capital Budget ending with their Regular Meeting of December 16, 2024.

Council has authorized a **2025 Community Survey** seeking residents' thoughts and opinions on issues and opportunities for Blaine Lake. This is the 1st time that the Town has formally engaged with the Community on a variety of topics seeking their advice and guidance as it plans for the next four years and beyond.
