

2025/2026 Strategic Plan Updates from the CAO:

The Town has completed a Grant Application to the Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund to replace a portion of the water and wastewater undergrounds.

The Town along with consultant will be establishing stakeholder meetings in January to discuss the potential of a new Community Hall and artificial ice at the Blaine Lake Arena.

The Town is excited to be working in partnership with Muskeg Lake Cree Nation to establish a Joint Working Group to implement the Memorandum of Understanding, It is anticipated that the initial meetings will be held in January, 2026.

The 2026 Budget discussions have started with the initial Capital items presented to Council on November 19, 2025 and 1st Budget Meeting scheduled for Tuesday, December 2, 2025.

There is a great ball facility located by the Blaine Lake School that has not been maintained to the Town's enhanced appearance standards. The Town has included funds in the initial 2026 Budget to complete some much needed maintenance. Is there a possibility of a Blaine Lake Minor Ball Association or a slow pitch league starting up? Want a copy of the Snow Removal Policy? Have Questions? Please contact the Town Office



- Residents should STAY HOME absent urgent or emergency situations.
- Property Owners/Residents are responsible for clearing snow and ice from their properties and adjacent sidewalks.
- Property Owners/Residents shall not push excess snow onto cleared areas.
- Following a major snow event (6-10 inches) it is the Town's objective to ensure that streets are passable within 24 hours.
- Response begins after snow has stopped.
- Priority is to blade/clear snow first from Main Street, followed by Avenues, then Streets.
